This project aims to protect the building, our collections and the stunning architecture for future generations whilst enhancing accessibility and positioning The Harris as a community hub for Preston and Lancashire.

# **Crane Operation**

The Harris has reached a significant phase in its ongoing restoration project. A crane operation has been completed to install Air Handling Units and roof gantries onto The Harris roof from Lancaster Road.

As part of the wider Harris Your Place project, these works are supported by Arts Council England's Capital Investment Programme specifically to improve the environmental conditions and standards of the special exhibition galleries located on the second floor, which will be named Gallery One.

New Air Handling Units will improve the way The Harris achieves and maintains conditions in the gallery and will enable The Harris to display a wider range of art works in these spaces than previously possible, working with a wide range of partners to deliver large-scale exhibitions and continuing to support high-quality cultural experiences in Preston.

The installation of Air Handling Units and roof gantries marks a major milestone in The Harris restoration project. This operation signifies our commitment to preserving heritage while embracing environmental responsibility. We are looking forward to welcoming visitors back to The Harris in Spring 2025.

# **Interior Updates**

Inside The Harris, the interior scaffolding has been removed, revealing the stunning ceilings and balconies as restoration work continues.



New LED lighting has been added, the original windows have been restored and now open to support natural ventiliation throughout the building.



The Changing Places toilet has now been installed.



The friezes around the rotunda and near the Egyptian Balcony have been thoroughly cleaned, restoring them to their former glory.









We spoke to Dave Ragan from Conlon Construction, Site Manager at The Harris Your Place project about his role throughout the capital project...

Tell us a little more about the project you're currently working on. I'm the Site Manager of The Harris, I've been here from the very start. I was the first one on site and I'll be the last to leave. I run the site from day to day. I'm the link between the designers and the tradesmen making sure the drawings are followed and everyone works safely and to a high standard. I deal with any problems that arise throughout the day which can be just about anything; no two days are ever the same.

Tell us a little more about what you like best about this project. It's interesting because it's an iconic building, I'd only ever been to the building once before and when I came I was more interested in the building rather than the actual collection. I was walking up and down the stairs looking at the building and how amazing it was while my wife and children looked at the exhibits. It's a pleasure to work here – an absolute honour. I've been here over 18 months and it still gives me a buzz coming to work each day.

Do you have any apprentices on site – it must be so exciting working on an important project at the start of your career? Yes it's been really rewarding for apprentices to start their career on a project of this scale – we have had a couple of joinery apprentices, a Trainee Site Manager and a Trainee Quantity Surveyor on a couple of days a week. We've had quite a few apprentice electricians on site as well.



# Programme Advisory Group

Meet Tony, a member of the Harris advisory group, who has written a short article about his relationship with the Harris, and some thoughts about the new community gallery.



I have spent a large amount of my career working in and around music, in an industry built on the foundations of people's creativity and talent.

Music is a very accessible and popular form of culture, which many of us come into contact with almost every day of our lives, without giving it much thought. Beethoven, Elvis, the Beatles, Queen, Sex Pistols, Bob Marley, Joy Division, 808 State, the Spice Girls, One Direction, Amy Winehouse, Adele, Ed Sheeran, Taylor Swift, Drake, Bad Bunny, and so on.

The foundations for today's culture were laid in the past, and the foundations for the future are being laid today.

Besides music, there are many other artforms, and means of cultural expression, some of which we might experience in Museums and Art Galleries.

I had long been aware of the Harris Museum, an incredible land mark building in the middle of Preston, but embarrassingly, it wasn't until I was in my 40s, circa 2017, that I actually visited. At the time we were just starting Preston Jazz Festival, which had a representative from Preston City Council on the steering group, and I was collaborating with a friend, Johnny Jay, on other projects, who was also interested in working with museums.

Not having done anything with museums before, we weren't sure if it would be possible, but we came up with some ideas, and approached the Harris, who were incredibly helpful.

The result was a number of activities, designed to celebrate and share culture. Examples of these included Gypsy Jazz performances as part of the Jazz festival, performances by local musicians including the accomplished Paul Birchall with his exploration of the Minimoog, and the (at the time) sixteen year old Prestonian Harvey Brittain, whose career is currently taking off in the US.

We also celebrated the sounds of traditional South Asian instruments with Aziz Ibrahim, and Shirley May's poetry with Johnny Jay at an event called 'Not all of us came on the Windrush'. Then the pandemic happened, but we didn't let that stop us, as we put on a safe concert called 'Balconi' where members of improvisational band Cold Bath Street performed live on different floors, with multiple cameras for the online audience to choose from.

It turns out that Museums and Galleries are great places to do things, and these things can often lead to other things. Interestingly Johnny and Aziz both went on the be community curators for the award winning South Asian Gallery at Manchester Museum, and the cycle continues.

Soon the Harris will reopen, and the new Gallery 2, a gallery space where anyone can apply to put on an exhibition, is a clear invitation and platform for the people of Preston and the surrounding areas to celebrate and share culture and creativity across a range of artforms. The opportunity and process are clear for all to see. No guess work required, and if you have any questions, just reach out to the Harris, who I know will be helpful.

Culture and creativity bring us together. They belong to anyone and everyone. What will tomorrow's culture be? This is something that we can potentially contribute to at the Harris.

# **Harris Volunteers**





Our volunteers have been working with The Harris Curators on a plan of action related to how to best get Harris Volunteers involved in helping out with moving collections carefully back into The Harris.

Our Fine Art Curator and three volunteer Fine Art Champions: Mehak, lain, and Charlotte, organised a 'Fine Art Collections Care' workshop for the Harris Volunteers. They looked at four framed paintings from The Harris' Fine Art Collection and the Fine Art Champs explained how each painting is condition checked, from unwrapping to looking for damage with a torch and recording everything onto a care sheet.

We want our volunteers to be well prepared, organised and confident! So, we've devised a monthly schedule of training that volunteers will be expected to complete before getting involved in the moving process.

The Youth Panel have been preparing themselves for the selection process and interview for an artist - street, graffiti, muralist, designer, illustrator - who will create a new commission for The Harris' new young people's space, **No.9**.

The Youth Panel have created the call out for the artist, the selection criteria and the interview questions and will be shortlisting applications and interviewing the four shortlisted artists. Let's hope the artists are prepared for a grilling!

It will be crucial that the artist selected is willing to get to know exactly what young people are all about so that they can create an artwork that young people will respect. The Youth Panel have their work cut out for them, so far they have received 86 expressions of interest and 29 actual applications.

We will introduce the chosen artist in the Autumn Guide, so keep an eye out.

# Fauna by Jacqueline Bishop



The Harris is thrilled to announce a new acquisition to our collection, presented by the Contemporary Art Society. Jacqueline Bishop's Fauna includes a fine bone china teacup, saucer and sugar bowl glazed with digital transfers.

Fauna sheds light on overlooked narratives of enslaved women in Caribbean society.

Commissioned by The Harris, this evocative ceramic work intertwines botanical elements with maternal themes, unveiling poignant stories of resilience. Displaying alongside historical pieces, Fauna sparks dialogues on the global history of tea and colonialism. Don't miss its unveiling in Spring 2025!

"One question we keep coming back to if we add what we know of the contemporary picture to Weld's notes from 150 years ago, what can this tell us about how things might look 150 years in the future?"

# Khaled Hafez



We are thrilled to announce the selected artist for the highly anticipated commission supported by the IWM 14-18 NOW Legacy Fund. Renowned Egyptian artist Khaled Hafez will be the creative force behind the new artwork set to feature in The Harris upon its reopening in 2025.

Khaled Hafez, a multifaceted artist whose work encompasses painting, video/film, photography, installation, and interdisciplinary approaches, brings a unique perspective to the project. Hafez's core research delves into the nature of identity, particularly focusing on a composite identity woven from African, Middle Eastern, Mediterranean, Arab, Islamic, ancient Egyptian, and Judeo-Christian influences.



In my current video, photography, and mixed media works, I am interested in movement, an element deeply embedded in ancient Egyptian art. I use symbols and codes from various ancient cultures to explore universal heritage.

### **Khaled Hafez**



The upcoming commission will utilise The Harris' collections to reveal stories relevant to contemporary audiences and will look to engage local communities, fostering connections between Preston and Egypt.

The Harris is part of the IWM 14-18 NOW Legacy Fund, a national partnership programme of over 20 ambitious artist commissions inspired by the heritage of conflict. The IWM 14-18 NOW Legacy Fund will enable The Harris to delve into these shared histories of conflict and connection.

Through this partnership, we aim to engage audiences with stories of conflict in innovative and compelling ways. The IWM 14-18 NOW Legacy Fund commissions will be on public display across the UK between 2023 and 2025, providing a platform for artistic engagement and dialogue.
